

# **6 Month Software Development Internship**

# The company

Despite its conservative name, the host company was established to revolutionise the way enterprise grade software is built and integrated. It intends to substantially reduce the \$1T spent globally with the software services sector, shifting the emphasis away from hand-crafted code towards reusable components and automated assembly. This is the industrialisation of enterprise software.

To achieve this, the company has created a new formal language to capture and regularise the way big organisations carry out day-to-day activities. Using this, experts work together to develop best practise for their own operational areas. This becomes the specification for the software systems that support those operations. Code is generated by the language to integrate those systems, without the need for any hand crafting. Of course all this only applies to common, well understood activities, but today, even these are high risk, high cost challenges for big organisations like business, government, health care and the military. This is why there are so many headlines about software project failures.

The experts who use the language are likely to be anywhere in the world and it is expected that teams of 4-6 people will work together to develop best practise in their areas. This means the language needs to be offered within a collaboration platform, which is made available as Software as a Service. The platform not only enables remote, collaborative editing, but also version control and user access control.

The company was formally established in September 2013 and consists of the founder and CEO, and the CIO, working with other collaborators and advisors. Both have extensive experience in telecoms management software, which is the initial focus of the business. It is pre-revenue at this stage and is based in Bath, Somerset in the south west of the UK, where the candidate will work.

## The role

This is an amazing opportunity for a student to become involved at the start of a major transformation in software and become part of the story. The candidate will support the development of the management platform, focusing on the development, test and documentation of the web-based presentation layer and the user experience. This will sit above the enterprise-grade core platform that is built using the eclipse workbench. Maximum use will be made of off-the-shelf Open Source software.

The intention is to make the whole solution data driven and re-configurable, using well defined software components and explicit orchestration. This means the candidate will gain valuable experience in the development of high quality, well designed software as well as the Open Source software market. They will also benefit from exposure to how the enterprise software market place works and the enterprises that use it.

#### **Start**

The start date is ideally summer 2014, or as soon as possible given the Erasmus process and academic schedule.

#### **Duration**

The scope of the internship is 6 months, but the hope is to maintain the relationship beyond this.

## Location

Bath. A world-heritage city in the South West of England which hosts two great universities. With a truly international feel it has wonderful cultural experiences and is just 1.5 hour train journey from London and a 15 minute train journey from the vibrant city of Bristol.
